Post Title:	Midday Supervisory Assistant

Overall purpose of job:

To work as part of a team monitoring pupil behaviour during the midday break to ensure a caring and safe environment. Required to work indoors and outdoors when supervising the children and young people to ensure their safety.

Main duties and responsibilities:

- 1. Supervise the playground area, playing fields, cloakrooms, classrooms etc. during the lunchtime break.
- 2. Assist with the removal of food and equipment once pupils have eaten their lunch.
- 3. Deal with minor first aid incidents; follow appropriate procedures for recording and reporting.
- 4. Assist in the implementation of appropriate behaviour management strategies as required
- 5. Observe a child or young person's behaviour, understand its context, and notice any unexpected changes and report any inappropriate behaviour to the correct member of staff.
- 6. Resolve minor disputes between pupils
- 7. Assist in the supervision of other activities during the midday break, including setting out and storing equipment
- 8. Report any concerns about pupil welfare to the appropriate member of staff in a confidential manner.
- 9. Establish rapport and respectful, trusting relationships with children, young people and those caring for them.
- 10. Provide support and encouragement to children and young people.
